


Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

In recent years there has been an increased awareness of an extremely violent conflict in the **Democratic Republic of the Congo** ("DRC") and its neighbouring countries (together with the DRC, the "affected countries"), which were partially funded for the exploitation and trade in cassiterite, columbite-tantalite (coltan), gold, tungsten and three derivatives – tin, tantalum and tungsten ("Conflict minerals") – by armed groups in the affected countries.

La Farga has drawn up a Conflict Minerals Policy which makes clear its position regarding the supply of these minerals and/or countries. La Farga is a company committed to sustainable development and to compliance with the law.

Our commitments:

1. To ensure respect for human rights and not to contribute to conflict, torture, inhuman treatment, forced labour, exploitation of children, or other violations of international human rights, crimes against humanity or genocide.
2. To adopt the necessary measures to ensure that the metals used in our manufacturing processes do not come from areas of conflict. This includes measures such as: asking our relevant suppliers to provide declarations of origin of conflict-free areas, adding the commitments set forth in this policy to our internal rules of procedure and code of ethics, compliance audits, etc.
3. Supporting the aims and objectives of the **Dodd-Frank Act** with regard to the supply of Conflict Minerals, and working to instruct our metal suppliers about Conflict Minerals.
4. Not working with a supplier if La Farga determines that the product is not Conflict-Free.
